Thought for the Week

A Mighty Great God

Isaiah 40:28 - Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; His understanding is unsearchable.

They tell me that Hurricane Harvey killed more than 60 people, caused damage which has been estimated to be as high as \$180 billion, and dropped more than 40 inches of rain upon certain locations.

They tell me Hurricane Irma is the most powerful Atlantic hurricane in recorded history. They say it is so powerful it is shaking the earthquake seismograph machines. Irma is generating winds of 185-plus miles per hour, and heaven help the place where it comes on land.

Although I've heard the reports and I've seen the videos, I have to confess I don't understand that kind of power.

They tell me one of the strongest forces in the universe is a super-massive black hole. For example, computer models say the super black hole of the M87 galaxy weighs about as much as 6.4 billion of our suns. They say anything which gets close to that monster will be sucked in, and it won't be coming out in the immediate future.

Although I've tried to read and understand all of this about the power of a black hole, I have to confess I really can't wrap my mind around facts and figures that are so immense and intimidating. Simply stated, I don't understand that kind of power. And just as simply stated, nobody else does either.

It is possible to stand in awe and wonder of such forces, but we cannot completely, thoroughly, understand them.

All of which leads me to ask, if we cannot understand the forces of creation which are perceivable and, theoretically speaking, measurable, why is it so many people think they can easily comprehend the mind and discern the motive of the great Creator? Still that is what happens after every cataclysmic event. People demand to know, "Why has God done, or allowed, such a thing to happen?"

It's highly unlikely we could understand even if the Lord sat us down and explained His thinking in depth. Let me ask, do you understand why:

- the Lord would want to rescue Adam and Eve after they had just rejected Him to follow the advice of a serpent?
- He would send His innocent Son to carry the sins of every person who has ever lived?
- He still cares for us even though we daily sin often?

Truly, God's ways are not ours; we cannot understand them. All we can do is thank and praise, serve and obey Him because He cares so very much.

THE PRAYER: Dear Lord, we give thanks that You cannot be defined or contained by man's measurements. Truly, Your love, grace, care, and compassion are things to be praised, honored, and appreciated. May we do so in the Name of Jesus who is Your greatest gift to us. Amen.

School to School-Helping Lutheran Schools Affected by Recent Hurricanes



In response to the devastation from Hurricane Harvey, LCMS School Ministry and LCMS Disaster Response developed a plan for assisting schools affected by this natural disaster.

Schools have the opportunity to choose one or more affected schools they wish to support. They can pray for their adopted school, and provide resources in response to specific needs. One hundred percent of all monetary donations will go directly to the affected schools. In this way, Lutheran schools across the

nation and around the world can support other schools who are attempting to recover and tangibly assist in their road to recovery.

Lutheran Central has decided to adopt Lutheran South Academy in Houston, Texas. Lutheran South is a K-12 school of about 800 students. As a result of Hurricane Harvey the school sustained extensive building damage making it unusable for a month with construction continuing until January 2018. The entire student body has been temporarily relocated to nearby church until school buildings are safe to occupy. They lost a tremendous amount of classroom and extracurricular content that will well exceed the insurance coverage. Additionally, there were eight staff members and over 30 school families whose homes that completely flooded.

Our chapel offerings during the month of October and the chapel offering from grandparents day will go to support Lutheran South Academy. Please continue to keep all affected by these recent natural disasters in your prayers!

NWEA Assessments

The dates given for the fall NWEA assessments were incorrect on the school calendar. The fall NWEA assessments will be administered September 25 - October 6. Each student in grades 2-8 will be testing in the areas of math, reading, and language arts, while students in Kindergarten and 1st grade will be testing in Math and Reading. This is an online testing program. Because the results of the NWEA assessments are received very quickly, decisions about curriculum can be made promptly to further improve student learning. Tax Credit Scholarships, better known as "SGO Scholarships", are scholarships awarded by Scholarship Granting Organizations to low- and middle-income families to help them afford the nonpublic school of their choice. SGOs were enacted in 2009, and have been expanded in subsequent years as a key component of the Indiana School Choice effort. Donations to fund SGO scholarships feature a 50% state tax credit for the donor.
