And what does His Word say? It declares Christ true God and man, who is our Savior from our sins. Over and over the Word directs us to Christ and away from ourselves. By the Word we learn repentance for our sins and faith in Jesus. The Word directs us to have Jesus at the font and altar, and from the pulpit. The Word rescues us from the vague ideas about God in our hearts and gives us real, solid truth.

To not want a pastor--not want to be under his care or not want to be a part of Christ's Church--is to say that there is some other way to have and know God. And there isn't any other way.

Yet the Lord's way of doing things is given for our assurance and certainty. After all, the crazy ideas we have will come and go but the unchanging Word of God, faithfully delivered by the pastors He calls, will always serve to rescue us from sin and death and give us forgiveness and life. Milk Substitutions for Students

Over the last week we have had an increase in the number of student requesting water at lunch. Because Lutheran Central School participates in the National School Lunch Program (NLSP) there are certain requirements we must meet in regards to serving milk at lunch. These requirements are outlined below.

1. If a student has a milk allergy or lactose intolerance we must provide an appropriate substitute. The substitute must have nutritional value that is equivalent to cow's milk.
2. We will be providing lactose free milk to those students who are not able to drink cow's milk. If a child needs to drink lactose free milk please provide a written request from the child's parent/guardian that identifies the student's medical or other special dietary need that precludes the consumption of cow's milk.
3. If the student needs juice, water, or a milk substitute not nutritionally equivalent to cow's milk due to a medical need we **must have** a medical statement signed by a health care provider with prescriptive authority. The medical statement must include:
 - ▶ Information about the child's physical impairment that is sufficient to allow the school to understand how it restricts the child's diet.
 - ▶ An explanation of what must be done to accommodate the child's dietary needs.
 - ▶ The food or foods to be omitted and recommended alternatives, in the case of a modified meal.

We appreciate your assistance with this matter. Providing the necessary documentation will assist us in maintaining our compliance with the policies and procedures of the NLSP.

Tax Credit Scholarships, better known as “SGO Scholarships”, are scholarships awarded by Scholarship Granting Organizations to low- and middle-income families to help them afford the nonpublic school of their choice. SGOs were enacted in 2009, and have been expanded in subsequent years as a key component of the Indiana School Choice effort. Donations to fund SGO scholarships feature a 50% state tax credit for the donor.
